

CLASSES OF NOXIOUS WEEDS AS AT 2013

Classes 1, 2 and 5 are notifiable weeds – an occupier must notify the Local Control Authority (LCA, generally local Council) within 24 hours of discovering the plant.

Class 1

The plant must be eradicated from the land and the land must be kept free of the plant. This class applies to the whole of NSW.

Class 2

The plant must be eradicated from the land and the land must be kept free of the plant. This class applies to selected regions within NSW.

Class 3

The plant must be fully and continuously suppressed and destroyed.

Class 4

The growth of the plant must be managed in a manner that reduces its number, spread and incidence and continuously inhibits its reproduction, and/or the plant may not be sold, propagated or knowingly distributed (*4 in the table).

Class 5

The requirements of the Noxious Weeds Act 1993 for a notifiable weed must be complied with. This class applies to the whole of NSW.

The final column indicates whether the weed is listed as a **Weed of National Significance**, or is on the **Alert List** of significant weeds which are poorly established in Australia and which it may be feasible to eradicate from the country.
